MINUTES OF REORGANIZATION MEETING OF JANUARY 2, 2013

#2013-02 (Committee resolution)

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the following resolution be adopted: That all Township officials be present at each meeting on a quarterly basis

Monthly department reports are required from the Tax Assessor, Tax Collector, Chief

Finance Officer, Building Department, Zoning Officer, Warren County Health Department, Knowlton Court and Animal Licensing Official to be given to the Clerk one week prior to the Township Committee meeting.

The Township Clerk, Building Department, Zoning Officer, and the Animal Licensing Official shall turn over monies collected and in hand on a weekly basis to the Township Clerk to be deposited.

Interest on current and delinquent taxes shall be 8% on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00. A penalty of up to 6% may be charged on any delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 if not paid by the end of the calendar year.

The Lakeland Bank is depository for monies collected by the Tax Collector, Chief Finance Officer, Zoning Officer, Animal Licensing Official, Building Department, COAH, Small Cities and Township Clerk.

The Bank of America is the depository for monies collected by the Chief Finance Officer for escrow account.

The New Jersey Herald and Express-Times are the official newspapers for the publication of all legal items.

The Tax Collector is authorized to issue tax search requests.

The Tax Assessor is authorized to issue certified list of property owners.

#2013-03 (Budget resolution)

WHEREAS, N.J.SA.40A:4-19 provides that the governing body may and, if any contracts, commitments or payments are to be made prior to the adoption of the budget, shall, by resolution adopted within the first 30 days of the beginning of the fiscal year, make appropriations to provide for the period between the beginning of the adoption of the budget; and

WHEREAS, the total of the appropriations so made shall not exceed 25% of the total of the appropriations made for all purposes in the budget for the preceding fiscal year, excluding, in both instances, appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvement fund and public assistance; and

WHEREAS, the date of this resolution is within the first thirty (30) days of January 2013; and

WHEREAS, one-fourth of the total appropriations in the 2012 budget, exclusive of any appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvements fund and public assistance in said 2013 budget in the sum of \$200,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Frelinghuysen Township Committee that the following appropriations be made and that a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Chief Finance Officer for her records.

#2013-04: (Open Space Tax)

WHEREAS, section 2-39.3 of the Ordinances of the Township of Frelinghuysen requires that the Open Space tax for the year 2013 be set at or before the meeting when the budget is adopted; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen desires to establish a \$0.02 cent open space tax per \$100.00 of ratable for each and every taxable property located within the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 2013 Open Space Tax is hereby established at \$0.02 cents per \$100.00 of ratable pursuant to Section 2-39.2.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that David Boynton shall be appointed as "Director of Public Works" for the year 2013.

#2013-07 (Authorize Township Attorney to represent township in tax matters)

WHEREAS, a resolution by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen is required in order for the Township Attorney to represent the Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation, and to sign documents relating to tax appeals and other real property tax matters before such board; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren and State of New Jersey that Edward Wacks, the Township attorney, and the firm of Wacks & Hartmann, LLC or any other attorney authorized to represent Frelinghuysen Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation, in connection therewith to sign and file petitions of appeal or counter-petitions, to sign and file answers, to make motions and to sign motion papers, to sign stipulations, including stipulations of settlement, and to take all other actions and sign all other documents appropriate to the representation of Frelinghuysen Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation and New Jersey Court, as applicable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be supplied to the Warren County Tax Board, Belvidere, New Jersey, and to the Frelinghuysen Township Tax Assessor.

#2013-08 (Authorize signature on township checks)

The contracts/agreements for Maser Consulting and Land Conservancy are on hold.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPTION:

Motion was made by DeCarolis, seconded by Kuhn to open the meeting to the public. All were in favor. Spoke were:

Loren Greco who asked what is the job description for the public works director Donna Zilberfarb who mentioned that the recycling coordinator and forestry management coordinator was not on the miscellaneous appointments.

Motion was made by Desiderio, seconded by Stracco to close the meeting to the public. All were in favor.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

The Committee would like to make the following accomplishments for the year 2013:

1. Consider reviewing our ordinances and make recommendations for ordinances that are obsolete. Committee Stracco will handle.

2. Consider changing meeting time to 7:00 p.m. This was determined that it would be a hardship for Committeemen Kuhn and Stracco.

3. With regard to the presentation of the scholarships; in the past the Mayor has presented. This year, Mayor Boynton would like Committeeman Kuhn to present.

4. Committeeman Stracco would like the PO zone reexamined. He suggested that an ordinance be drafted to submit to the Planning Board for their recommendations. It was decided to readdress this when the township attorney is present.

Committeeman Stracco asked the Committee to consider introducing a resolution, which would be non-binding, to encourage the NJDEP to reconsider the annual bear hunt in order to allow the bears to rebound. He will present the resolution at a later date.
Committeeman Kuhn, who went on the New Years day walk on the FFP, would like

to continue to see the teamwork on developing the property.

7. Mayor Boynton asked the Committee to consider solar on the other end of the 5 acre property. Since this is in the transition area it cannot be done. Solar panels were looked at for the 59 acre property on Route 94 and were found to be non-profitable for the company. Motion was made by Desiderio, seconded by Stracco to have Laura Brill put the four corners in as per plan. All were in favor.

8. Committeeman Desiderio asked about the development of the 59 acres on Route 94. What is to be subdivided is needed to be voted on. When the surveyor was asked to stake the area she advised Mr. Desiderio that it needed to be discussed further as a few residents have different opinions. It was decided that Mayor Boynton would handle this. Mr. Desiderio also brought up the fact that a new garage is needed as the equipment is being kept outdoors as there is no room and the vehicles are rusting out.

At this time the Committee met with the Open Space Committee and Farmland Preservation Committee.

Mayor Boynton asked the two boards if they had any thoughts on going to 6 meetings year instead of the 12. Robin Randolph stated that on the off months an application could be held up. After further discussion it was decided that there would be 6 meetings a year and continue with 3 joint meetings.

Motion was made by Kuhn, seconded by Desiderio reappointing the existing Open Space Committee adding Desiderio as the Recreation Committee member. All were in favor.

Motion was made by Stracco, seconded by DeCarolis to approve appointments for Farmland Preservation as Mayor stated. All were in favor.

Motion was made by DeCarolis, seconded by Kuhn to appoint the members to the Environment Commission.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, motion was made at 8:30 p.m to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor.
