MINUTES OF REORGANIZATION MEETING OF JANUARY 3, 2012

The reorganization meeting of the Frelinghuysen Township Committee was held in the Municipal Building, 210 Main Street, Johnsonburg, New Jersey on Tuesday, January 3, 2012 and was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by the Municipal Clerk.

SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT:

#2012-02 (Committee resolution)

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the following resolution be adopted:

That all Township officials be present at each meeting on a quarterly basis

Monthly department reports are required from the Tax Assessor, Tax Collector, Chief Finance Officer, Building Department, Zoning Officer, Warren County Health Department, Knowlton Court and Animal Licensing Official to be given to the Clerk one week prior to the Township Committee meeting.

The Township Clerk, Building Department, Zoning Officer, and the Animal Licensing Official shall turn over monies collected and in hand on a weekly basis to the Township Clerk to be deposited.

Interest on current and delinquent taxes shall be 8% on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00. A penalty of up to 6% may be charged on any delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 if not paid by the end of the calendar year.

The Lakeland Bank is depository for monies collected by the Tax Collector, Chief Finance Officer, Zoning Officer, Animal Licensing Official, Building Department, COAH, Small Cities and Township Clerk.

The Bank of America is the depository for monies collected by the Chief Finance Officer for escrow account.

The New Jersey Herald and Express-Times are the official newspapers for the publication of all legal items.

The Tax Collector is authorized to issue tax search requests.

The Tax Assessor is authorized to issue certified list of property owners.

#2012-03 (Temporary budget)

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.40A:4-19 provides that where any contract commitment or payments are to be made prior to the final adoption of the 2011 budget, temporary appropriations should be made for the purpose and amounts required in the manner and time herein provided; and

WHEREAS, the date of this resolution is within the first thirty (30) days of January 2011; and

WHEREAS, one-fourth of the total appropriations in the 2010 budget, exclusive of any appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvements fund and public assistance in said 2011 budget in the sum of \$239,600.00.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Frelinghuysen Township Committee that the following appropriations be made and that a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Chief Finance Officer for her records.

#2012-04 (Setting Open Space tax)

WHEREAS, section 2-39.3 of the Ordinances of the Township of Frelinghuysen requires that the Open Space tax for the year 2012 be set at or before the meeting when the budget is adopted; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen desires to establish a \$0/02 cent open space tax per \$100.00 of ratable for each and every taxable property located within the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 2012 Open Space Tax is hereby established at \$0.02 cents per \$100.00 of ratable pursuant to section 2-39.2.

#2010-05 (Appointing township professionals)

WHEREAS, there exists a need for various Township Professionals; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et. seq) requires that the resolution authorizing the award of contracts for "Professional Services" without competitive bids must be publicly advertised.

WHEREAS, the following award is for a contract that is not in excess of \$26,000 as certified by the Chief Finance Officer of the Township of Frelinghuysen, and pursuant to N.J.S.A.19:44A-20.4, may be awarded by the Township Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the following for the term indicated:

2. This contract is awarded without competitive bidding as "Professional Services" under the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law because these are recognized professionals licensed and regulated by law and it is not feasible to obtain competitive bids.

3. A copy of this resolution shall be published in the New Jersey Herald and The Express Times as required by law, within ten days of its passage.

#2012-06 (Appoint personnel of the Public Works Dept)

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works for the Township of Frelinghuysen shall have charge of and supervision over the care, maintenance and construction of all streets, alleys and public ways; the construction, operation and maintenance of all storm-water and sanitary sewers, and all street gutters and drains and the appurtenances thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Works consist of the Director of Public Works and shall be under the immediate control and direction of the Township Committeeman in charge of public works, who shall be designated "Director of Public Works" and who shall be subject and subordinate to the ultimate control and direction of the Township Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Thomas Charles shall be appointed as "Director of Public Works" for the year 2012.

Motion was made by Boynton, seconded by Desiderio to adopt said resolution. Roll call vote: Durling-yes, Charles-yes, Desiderio-yes, Boynton – yes, DeCarolis-yes.

#2012-07 (Tax matters)

WHEREAS, a resolution by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen is required in order for the Township Attorney to represent the Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation, and to sign documents relating to tax appeals and other real property tax matters before such board;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren and State of New Jersey that Edward Wacks, the Township attorney, and the firm of Wacks & Hartmann, LLC or any other attorney authorized to represent Frelinghuysen Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation, in connection therewith to sign and file petitions of appeal or counter-petitions, to sign and file answers, to make motions and to sign motion papers, to sign stipulations, including stipulations of settlement, and to take all other actions and sign all other documents appropriate to the representation of Frelinghuysen Township before the Warren County Board of Taxation and New Jersey Court, as applicable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be supplied to the Warren County Tax Board, Belvidere, New Jersey, and to the Frelinghuysen Township Tax Assessor.

#2012-08 (Transfer resolution)

WHEREAS, there are insufficient funds to meet the demands necessary for the 2011 budget in Emergency Management OE, Fire Sub-Code Official OE, Public Health (Board of Health) OE, and Recreation OE; and

WHEREAS, the following account has sufficient excess funds to meet such demands: Social Security.

All were in favor except David Boynton who abstained.
