2021-01 CALENDAR YEAR 2021 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 1.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and, WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference

between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and, WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen in the County of Warren finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2021 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and, WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 2.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$22,203.18 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and, WHEREAS the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years. NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, in the County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Frelinghuysen shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$31,084.45, and that the CY 2021 municipal budget for the Township of Frelinghuysen be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption. **CERTIFICATION**

#2021-02 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2020-11, GRANTING MUNICIPAL CONSENT FOR THE OPERATION OF A CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF FRELINGHUYSEN, NEW JERSEY TO CSC TKR, LLC WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2020-11, the Frelinghuysen Township Mayor and Committee granted municipal consent for the operation of a cable television system within Frelinghuysen Township to CSC TKR, LLC; and WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate to revise Section 10 of that Ordinance 2020-11 as set forth below, without otherwise amending the terms of that Ordinance. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Township Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, and State of New Jersey, as follows: SECTION I Section 10 of Ordinance 2020-11 is hereby deleted in its entirety, and replaced with the following: SECTION 10. FREE SERVICE

Subject to applicable federal regulations, the Company shall, upon written request, provide free of charge, one (1) standard installation and monthly cable television reception service to all State or locally accredited public schools and all municipal public libraries, as well as municipal buildings located within the Municipality. Upon written request from the Township, the Company shall provide to the Township at: (a) Town Hall at 210 Main Street and; (b) one (1) additional Township owned facility currently passed by the Company's System, without charge, the following at each: (1) one standard installation; (2) one cable modem per installation; and (3) cable modem service for the term of this Ordinance for each installation. This offer shall be subject to the terms, conditions and use policies of the Company as those policies may exist from time to time. SECTION II Except as amended herein, Ordinance No. 2020-11 shall remain in full force and effect. FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law. The owner shall bear the reasonable costs of towing and storage before regaining possession of the vehicle. Section II 1. If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. 3.
